

At the May Council meeting, it was that time of year where everything was reset in terms of positions, roles and responsibilities for Councillors. This being said though, the was no change for your 3 Ward Members, with Andrew being elected SHDC Vice-Chairman (and will continue to support Chairman Paul Redgate) and continuing as Chairman of the Policy Development Panel. Anthony



continues his role in the Cabinet as Portfolio Holder for Public Protection and Rodney also continues his Cabinet position as Portfolio Holder for Assets and Planning.

SHDC has begun expanding its popular Garden Waste Scheme, offering 5,000 more subscriptions and bins across the District, bringing the total number of collections to 15,000. A third truck was added to the fleet early May, and the garden waste team have begun contacting residents who have previously registered an interest in subscribing to the service. Any residents who have not yet registered an interest, but would like to join the popular garden waste scheme, can do so by going onto **www.sholland.gov.uk** and searching for Garden Waste Expansion. Residents without access to the internet, can still register an interest by phoning the customer contact team (**01775 761161**). When a space then becomes available the Garden Waste Team would then contact via telephone or in writing. With the cost of fuel reaching record high's, it is comforting that 18 new electric vehicle charging spaces will be installed across three locations in Spalding and Holbeach later this year, after SHDC was successful in bidding for the Government's On-Street Residential Charge-Point Scheme and new 7kW dual charge points will be installed in three council car parks across the two towns, at the following locations:

Holland Road car park, Spalding: 4 dual charge points Winfrey Avenue car park, Spalding: 3 dual charge points Boston Road car park, Holbeach: 2 dual charge points.

These new chargers will add to the three car parks that already have electric vehicle spaces in Spalding, at Vine Street, Victoria Street and the visitors' car park at the Council's Priory Road offices.

A chance of being a lucky winner whilst supporting local causes will soon be possible with the launch of the South & East Lincolnshire Community Lottery. When the lottery launches this Autumn, people will be able to purchase tickets online, and support the good cause of their choice. Tickets will cost £1 a week. The draw will be weekly with a jackpot of £25,000, other prizes being £2,000, £250 and £25. Good causes will soon be invited register to raise funds with South & East Lincolnshire Community Lottery, and keep 50%% from every ticket they sell. A further 10% from every ticket will go into a Central Fund that will be distributed to more good causes, with the remainder being put towards prizes, operating costs and VAT. Hello everyone

The previous priority for the Spalding Rural East area was to do with the accumulation of vehicles which were in a concerning position. A meeting was held between police and the business owner, there is some positive action being taken to resolve the issue.

With the summer term drawing to a close this means that Mini Police is coming to an end for this academic year. I have enjoyed going into my four primary schools to deliver lessons covering Diversity, Online Safety and Anti-Social Behaviour.

The Wellbeing group in Moulton asked for some information about Scams – this is a very big area and it was fortunate that Gillian from our Community Safety Department at Headquarters was able to come along to speak at this as she is an expert in the area. Her presentation was very informative. Please contact me if you run a group who may benefit from hearing about Scams.

There have also been some TOR's (Traffic Offence Reports) issued within the beat area for June, these relate to speeding and not wearing a seat belt.



Finding Fulfilment

Dear Friends,

This will be my last letter to you, as I am retiring from my role as your priest at the end of August. It has been a privilege to serve you for what has been almost sixteen years. I shall leave with many happy memories of my time

with you.

I have to acknowledge, however, that those of us who attend our worship services at Cowbit and Weston Hills are few: our attendances rarely reach double figures. Looking at the situation from this angle, it is easy to be pessimistic about the future of the Christian faith in our villages, especially as most of those who attend on Sunday are quite mature in age. But I do not believe we should be downhearted. God is still with us, and God's ways are not our ways. The Church is not going to die in this part of the world. It may change shape, but it will not die.

I base this on our Christian belief that God has created us in order that we might come to know God. I think that is what Genesis tells us when it says that were created in God's image (Genesis 1: 27). Being created in God's image does not mean that we look like God, but that we have been created to be in spiritual communion with God. The French philosopher, Blaise Pascal, put it another way when he wrote that we humans have been created with a God-shaped hole in our hearts. In other words, there is a part of us that yearns for spiritual comfort and fulfilment, comfort and fulfilment that we can only get from God. Saint Augustine said the same thing when he wrote of our hearts' being restless until they find their rest in God.

The problem is that many people today search for this fulfilment in the wrong places. It is our job as Christians to help them find the fulfilment that only God can give. To do this I think we need to convince the community that we are ready to listen respectfully to the spiritual questions of folk who are outside the Church but are wanting to talk about what gives meaning and purpose to life. I think there are many such folk out there. Our task is to show them that we Christians are here to be available to them and listen to them without seeking to cram religion down their throats. None in our congregations would think of cramming religion down anyone's throat. But sadly I think the Church suffers from the stereotype that this will be the case for anyone who dares to walk in the church door. So please know, you who are not part of the Church but would like to talk about faith, that you will be welcomed with sympathy if you come to one of our services or contact one of our church leaders.

Come September our services at Cowbit and Weston Hills will take place in each church twice a month. Our local ministers, Sally Wilson and Mary Haresign, will conduct these services. They are also available to speak with you about pastoral and spiritual matters. For baptisms, weddings, and funerals, please contact the Reverend Michael Howard. In closing I would like to thank all of you in our church congregations and in the wider community for making me welcome during these years of my ministry.

LET'S START WITH THE GOOD NEWS, THE NEW PLAY EQUIPMENT HAS BEEN OFFICIALLY OPENED AT WESTON HILLS PARK AND CREDIT MUST GO TO COUNCILLOR JANET BELLAMY FOR HER TIRELESS WORK OVER THE PASS 6 YEARS. WE SINCERELY HOPE THAT THE CHILDREN OF WESTON HILLS ENJOY THEIR TIME USING THIS EQUIPMENT.

HAVING SAID HOW QUIET IT HAD BEEN RECENTLY, YOU CAN ALWAYS RELY ON SOMEONE OR SOMETHING TO CUASE A STIR AND TRUE TO EVERYONES THOUGHTS PERSIMMON CAME TO THE FORE. SINCE THEY WENT ON SITE ON THE HIGH RD IN EARLY MAY THEY WERE USING PINFOLD LANE AS THEIR ACCESS POINT WHICH CAUSED LOCAL RESIDENTS CONCERNS WITH NOISE AND HOMES SHAKING BY THE VOLUME OF LORRIES ATTENDING THE SITE. IT ALSO CAUSED PROBLEMS ON THE HIGH RD WITH COUNTLESS VEHICLES PARKING WAITING TO GO ONTO THE SITE. I THEN BECAME AWARE OF A PLANNING APPLICATION WHICH OUTLINED THE ACCEPTED ACCESS TO THE SITE WHICH SHOULD HAVE BEEN FROM THE HIGH RD. TO CUT A LONG STORY SHORT AFTER MANY EMAILS. PHONE CALLS AND MEETINGS WITH PERSIMMON, SHDC & HIGHWAYS INFORMED PERSIMMON THAT THEY HAD UNTIL 17TH JUNE TO COMPLETE THE NEW ACCESS AND FROM THAT DATE PINFOLD LANE WILL NOT BE USED PLUS. THEY HAD TO MAKE GOOD ANY DAMAGE TO PINFOLD LANE. RESIDENTS OF WESTON NOW HAVE ANOTHER MAJOR PROBLEM WHICH IS DISRUPTING NORMAL LTFE DUE TO LCC HIGHWAYS INCOMPETENCE BY ALLOWING TWO ROAD CLOSURES TO OPERATE AT EXACTLY THE SAME TIME. ROAD CLOSURES AT THE TOP OF BROADGATE AT THE J/W THE HIGH ROAD INITIALLY MEANT ROAD USERS WERE TO USE SMALL DROVE AND THEN USE THE HIGH ROAD TO TRAVEL TO SPALDING. BUT THE TOTAL ROAD CLOSURE ON THE HIGH ROAD CLOSE TO THE ASHWOOD HOMES DEVELOPMENT MEANT THAT NOW RESIDENTS WILL HAVE TO USE THE A151 BYPASS IN ORDER TO TRAVEL TO SPALDING & WESTON HILLS. IT ALSO MEANS THAT THE LOCAL BUS SERVICES WILL NOT OPERATE ALONG THE HIGH RD UNTIL AFTER 1ST AUGUST WHEN THE PLANEED ROADWORKS ON THE HIGH RD ARE DUE TO FINISH.

AT NO TIME WERE RESIDENTS WARNED BY ANY ORGANISATION OF THE DISRUPTION THAT WOULD AFFECT THEIR DAILY LIVES WITH MANY PEOPLE BEING TRAPPED WITHIN THE VILLAGE MAINLY DUE TO BUSES NOT SERVCING WESTON.






