After the May elections, things are starting to settle down at SHDC with training taking place for new and old faces and positions being allocated for Councillors on committees and panels. For your Ward Councillors, Andrew was elected as Chairman of the Council (this is different to Leader who is now Nick Worth after taking over from Gary Porter). Andrew also continues to sit on Policy Development



Panel as Chairman, Performance Monitoring Panel and Planning Committee. Andrew is also the appointed representative for Spalding Air Training Corps. Anthony, continues where he left off by sitting on the Cabinet as Portfolio Holder for Public Protection which includes sitting on Licensing Committee and Licensing Panel. Anthony is also an appointed SHDC member for South Holland Internal Drainage Board and Welland and Deeping Internal Drainage Board. Thomas will be sitting on Planning Committee and Policy Development Panel. Thomas has also been appointed SHDC member for South Holland Internal Drainage Board. The new administration, each Ward Councillor receives a Designated Councillor Budget of £12,000 which can be used to support community projects over the 4 year period (to March 2027). Andrew and Anthony have used the previous allocations to support many local organisations over the past years and along with Thomas, we would look to consider applications once again. If you are a local organisation or group looking for funding, please contact one of us. Just under £300,000 has been sent from Government to SHDC as a one-off payment to help the Authority and its residents to support increased costs for the important work carried out by Internal Drainage Boards (IDB's). As part of a £1.5m sum across the partnership SHDC is part of with Boston Borough and East Lindsey District Council, this money is very welcome as almost half of the SHDC element of Council Tax share is for the IDB's. Hopefully, now this is recognised at Government level, funding will continue or an alternative way worked out so IDB costs are shared with more local authorities who share the same rivers as we do. SHDC communities are holding a give-it-a-go day on Sunday 13th August. This popular event, which is held in the Sir Halley Stewart field, Spalding gives everyone the opportunity of having a try at the various activities which includes Andrew's 'Chairman's Charity tug-o-war' competition. If you fancy having a go and can get a team of 7, please contact Andrew who will give more details. There will be a small entry fee, all of which goes to Andrew's selected charities Blood Cancer UK and Mencap.

Gooseberry Cheesecake

Method

1. Tip the gooseberries, 2 tbsp of the elderflower cordial and the orange juice into a saucepan. Cook over a medium heat for 10 mins until the gooseberries have softened but not broken down completely. Set aside.
2. Line the base of a deep 23cm spring-form cake tin with baking parchment. Blitz all the biscuits in a food processor to fine crumbs, then tip into a bowl. Melt the butter over a low heat and stir into the biscuit crumbs to combine. Tip into the tin and press down into an even base. Chill for at least 30 mins or up to 1 hr.
3. Put the soft cheese, mascarpone, remaining cordial and the orange zest in a bowl, and mix well to combine. Sift in the icing sugar and mix everything together. Fold in three-quarters of the cooked gooseberries along with 1 tbsp of their cooking liquid, then pour this over the biscuit base. Chill for at least 4 hrs or overnight.
4. Just before serving, remove the cheesecake from the tin and put on a cake plate or stand. Spoon the remaining gooseberries over the middle of the cheesecake, along with a drizzle of the cooking liquid



Ingredients

- 750g gooseberries
- 4 tbsp elderflower cordial
- 1 orange, zested and juiced
- 125g ginger biscuits
- 125g digestive biscuits
- 125g unsalted butter
- 500g soft cheese
- 250g mascarpone
- 125g icing sugar

Cowbit Parish News

At the Annual Parish Council meeting, we welcomed Carol Clerk and Peter Simpson, both of whom were elected, (uncontested), at the May elections, alongside Trevor Tyrrell, Eric Fragale, Janet Barnes and Daniel Sandhu. With the number of Members increased from 5 to 7 through Democratic Services at SHDC, it was unanimously agreed to co-opt James Stamp, who then joined the meeting. Chris Elliott had decided not to stand for re-election and the Chairman thanked him for his hard work and dedication to the role over the past years. Eric Fragale was nominated and following a unanimous vote, has taken on the role of Vice Chairman. At the recent, (July), meeting the Chairman advised that it was the 55th Anniversary of the flood of Cowbit, when it rained all day and by 5:30pm there were 4.5 inches of rain. There was, as usual, a very good turnout and many issues were raised. Notably, it was asked whether the PC could provide allotments for interested residents. The PC owns no land other than the Playing Field, so other options, such as asking Crowland PC if they would let their surplus plots to Cowbit residents, is being looked into. Residents asked whether local Dole Land could be used, but were advised that a lot of this land is not within the village, is leased long-term and can only be used for grazing. The site along from the village shop was also suggested and Mr Tyrrell said he would be happy to look into this. A new litter bin is being purchased by the 3 District Councillors, to replace the broken one by the Church. The drain cover by the old handwash site has still not been fixed, even though it has been reported on numerous occasions. Mr Stamp said that he would take this forward. The information maps are still being worked on, as the Ordinance Survey maps don't contain enough detail, the PC is consulting with the Drainage Boards.

THE COUNCIL ARE ALMOST AT THE STAGE WHEREBY WE CAN NOTIFY RESIDENTS OF THE PLANS TO UPGRADE/REPLACE PLAY EQUIPMENT ALONG SIDE OTHER FEATURES WHICH WE SINCERELY HOPE WILL ENCOURAGE MORE USE OF THE PARK.



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
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
