

## South Holland District Council

As many of you will be aware, National Grid have announced plans to build an 87-mile, 400,000-volt electricity network from Grimsby to Walpole in Norfolk, passing through South Holland and in particular our Ward Villages. Named "The Great Grid Upgrade", the proposal is to install new pylons, which in some cases will run parallel with existing pylons, whilst in other cases, the new pylons



will destroy the beautiful open skies we enjoy. Andrew, Anthony and Thomas attended the recent consultation event held in Moulton Seas End and are strongly against these proposals. Whilst we accept the need for the up-grade to ensure infrastructure is in place, going overground is not the way to do this where alternatives such as underground either on land or in the sea can be achieved – but cost more.....


National Grid's first round of consultation with stakeholders and the public ran out on March 13th, but this is a marathon, not a sprit, albeit we need a good start in order to keep a strong fight against these initial proposals. The major impact these plans could have on our communities and environment cannot be ignored, and we must fight this united and together.

The continued lobbying for a fairer solution for funding Internal Drainage Board (IDB's), continues to gain pace after ClIr Paul Redgate, presented at a House Of Commons event, the huge impact the levy increases are having and how this is leaving several small councils in a financially precarious position. The warning given was if no long-term solution is secured, councils will have no choice but to cut services residents rely on. IDB's are essential to our area, but water flows into other areas of the country who pay nothing. IDB's financial requirements have progressively impacted councils for the last decade, but in the last two years, the increases have reached unprecedented levels. This is following the sharp rise in utility costs and other factors such as wet weather events. To put this into context SHDC increased it Council Tax for 2024/25 by 3.09%, but 92% of this will be passed to the IDB's. Public consultation will soon be underway as the next step of the redevelopment for the Castle Sports Complex get's underway. This is the next stage following the £20m levelling-up money secured last year and includes 3 new swimming pools, a new 3G floodlit football pitch, changing pavilion and a multi-use games area for a variety of other sports. In addition, the project also looks to provide community rooms and space dedicated for use to provide a health and wellbeing hub including services for mental health, diabetes, Alzheimer's and dementia support. We value your comments, so please look our for further de-tails once the consultation is open.



Walking saved his life. Now it will help find him a family. Christian Lewis takes his next steps - along the coastline of Britain, and on the road of life. Since his time on Hildasay, Chris' adventure has only gotten wilder. No one was more surprised than Chris when, in November 2020, he had an unlikely (seeminaly destined) encounter with fellow adventurer Kate. The two turned out to be kindred spirits and – even more astonishingly - Kate made the bold decision to join Chris on the walk of a lifetime. Day in, day out, as they trekked the coastline down from Scotland together, their relationship grew, and soon the couple were thrown in at the deep end when their first child – baby Magnus – arrived. They've navigated the east coast of Scotland, through Yorkshire and East Anglia, and struggled on to the Jurassic Coast . In Hildasay to Home Chris finally crosses the finish line back in Swansea with almost half a million pounds raised.

He reflects beautifully on all that he's learned and the family he's found for himself along the way.



# Asparagus Quiche



### Method

- Sift the flour and salt together and rub in the butter until it resembles fine breadcrumbs. Make a little well in the centre and add the egg yolk and enough iced water to form a soft dough: 1½-2 tablespoon of water should be enough. Knead briefly until all the ingredients are well combined. Line a 23cm tart tin with the pastry and then place in the fridge for about 30 minutes.
- 2. Preheat the oven to 200°C/Gas 6.
- 3. After removing the pastry from the fridge, prick the base with a fork and line with greaseproof paper or foil and weigh down with baking beans (dried beans or lentils make a great substitute if you don't have baking beans). Bake for 10 minutes then remove paper or foil and beans and return to the oven for 5 minutes to dry out. Put aside to cool.
- 4. Cut the asparagus into 2cm lengths, keeping the tips separate. Pour about 4cms of water into a large saucepan, add salt and bring to the boil. Add the stem pieces and simmer for 5 minutes then add the tips and simmer gently for another 2-3 minutes then drain leave to cool.
- 5. Fry the onion gently in the butter until tender and then scatter over the base of the pastry case along with the asparagus and cheese.
- Whisk together the eggs, milk and cream along with some salt and pepper. Pour into the pastry case and then pop everything back into the oven for 25-30 minutes until just set in the centre and nicely browned. Serve hot, warm or cold.

#### Ingredients

Pastry case 225gms plain flour Pinch of salt 100gms chilled butter, diced 1 egg yolk Cold water

#### Filling

350gms asparagus (woody ends removed) 1 small onion, diced 100gms grated cheese – gruyere, gouda or emmental work well 15gms better 3 eggs 150mls milk 85mls double cream Salt and pepper

April and May are great months to start enjoying seasonal British produce and this quiche is a lovely way to enjoy fresh, local asparagus. It's a good idea to make the pastry case for this quiche a bit in advance as it does really benefit from chilling – alternatively, speed things up a bit with shop bought shortcrust pastry. Works equally well as a vegetarian dish or with a bit of ham or cooked bacon added in.



7:30pm at Weston Hills Village Hall.



We begin with the fantastic news that our school was awarded an overall rating of Good at a recent inspection by Ofsted. Undergoing a period of

transformation, we have moved from a rating of Requires Improvement at a previous inspection to now having two of the five key areas inspected rated as Outstanding. The report from Ofsted noted the high expectations of all pupils and commented that our pupils' attitudes to learning are exceptional; "They talk and interact with excitement about their learning." Leadership of the school was highlighted as aspirational and highly effective. Our executive headteacher, Sonya Ely said:

"I am delighted to officially confirm that the school has moved out of the previous 'requires improvement' category and is now regarded as a 'GOOD' school with many OUTSTANDING features identified- a wonderful way to start 2024! The Ofsted report opens with the sentence, 'Weston Hills is an ambitious and inclusive school' and in the words of one pupilrecorded by the inspector- 'I don't think any other primary school could beat this school. We are like one big, happy family- a family that learns but also has fun.' The children in particular are recognised for their exceptional behaviour and attitudes to learning. Early years, reading, maths, governance and provision for pupils with SEND are also highlighted as areas of significant strength. This report really is a celebration of the 'period of transformation' the school has been through and I would like to thank all involved for the contribution they have made to secure this judgement. I am incredibly proud of all our school family. To have made such significant progress in under four years- with two school closures due to the pandemic thrown into the mix- is an amazing achievement." We are always excited to celebrate World Book Day in March, and this year we had a range

of activities to encourage a love of books and reading for pleasure. To help every single child in our school to start or continue to build their own personal library of books, we held a book swap, where children could exchange their own pre-loved books for a token. Each token could then be exchanged for another pre-loved book. The children and staff were invited to come to school dressed as a book character or wearing their pyjamas; there were some amazing and imaginative costumes! At the end of the school day, the adults in school picked a book to share with the children, who chose the story they wanted to listen to.

We also had virtual visits from some of the authors who have written and illustrated books the children have recently been reading in school. David Melling read stories to our Key Stage 1 pupils and showed them how to draw. Some of our Key Stage 2 pupils did a quiz with author Terry Deary online, and had a talk themed around the British Museum. These were fantastic interactive events, enjoyed by all. We have had some other interesting visitors at our school; Holly and Willow Classes took part in an 'Earthquakes and Volcanoes Workshop' where they learned about the topic through drama. They went on to make volcano models at home, mixing bicarbonate of soda and vinegar and 'exploding' them in school. Holly and Willow Classes and Consent as part of PSHE, with lots of opportunities for discussion. *We are always looking for opportunities to engage with our local community and would like to share an invitation to all to join us for a coffee morning at Weston Hills Village Hall on Friday 24th May. 
