It's very pleasing to see the new Allison Homes development entrance on Roman Road, Moulton Chapel looking a lot more presentable and the notorious "ski slope" has been removed. You may remember this was strongly opposed by your Ward Councillors last year and after amended plans were put forward by the applicant to increase the site levels, this was refused at Planning Committee. This was, and is a strong message to developers, that whilst we understand there is a need for housing, it should be with good design, space and in keeping with the local area.

D-Day, Read all about it!



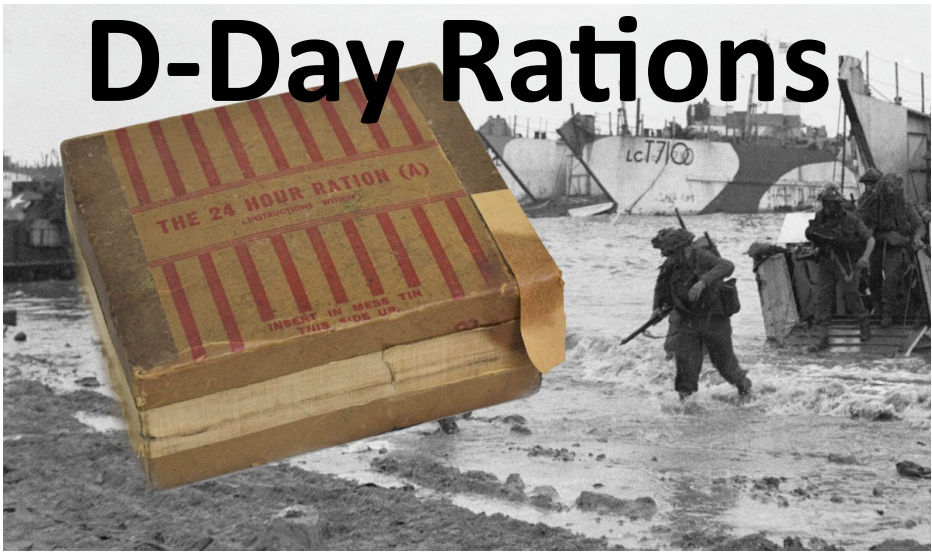
Operation Fortitude was the ingenious web of deception spun by the Allies to mislead the Nazis as to how and where the D-Day landings were to be mounted. 'One of the most creative intelligence operations of all time' – Kim Philby

The story of how this web was woven is one of intrigue, personal drama, ground-breaking techniques, internal resistance, and good fortune. It is a tale of double agents, black radio broadcasts, phantom armies, 'Ultra' decrypts, and dummy parachute drops. These diverse tactics were intended to come together to create a single narrative so compelling that it would convince Adolf Hitler of its authenticity.

Operation Fortitude was intended to create the false impression that the Normandy landings were merely a feint to disguise a massive forthcoming invasion by this American force in the Pas de Calais. In other words, the success of D-Day – the beginning of the end of the Second World War – was made possible by the efforts of men and women who were not present on the Normandy beaches.

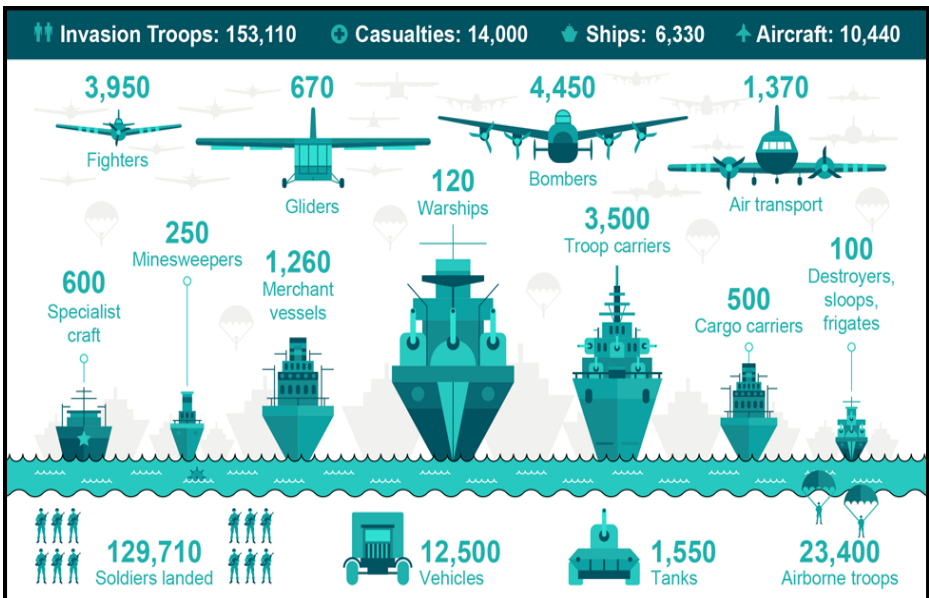

Cowbit Village Hall

It's been a busy couple of months at the village hall, with further improvements made possible through the funding received from the UK Shared Prosperity Fund last year. We recently purchased some new chairs with arms to help people, particularly elderly residents, to get in and out of the chairs more easily, which have proved very useful for groups such as the Tea@two, Cowbit Seniors Club and Bingo, but they also can be used for private bookings.

Our new front doors were installed in April by Unique Glazing (who have done a smashing job) which has improved both the security and the appearance of the hall – this project was, again, partly funded by the UK Shared Prosperity Fund but assisted by a generous donation from our three councillors Tony Casson, Andrew Woolf and Thomas Sneath. We held our AGM in May and have been delighted to formally welcome several new committee members who will be offering their time to ensure our hall continues to be available for use by those in the village and surrounding area. Two new groups started at the hall recently so if you are interested in short mat bowls or you have a baby or toddler to occupy, these may be of interest. Short mat bowls sessions now run on a Friday evening following the recent acquisition of the necessary kit – sign-up sessions are being offered free as a 'try before you buy' and it provides a great opportunity to try something new and connect with other villagers. Tiger Tots Baby and Toddler Group also recently held it's first session and looks set to become a regular feature on a Tuesday morning. Details of these events – and many more – can be found on our Facebook page or by taking a peep at our newly revamped notice boards. Finally, our charity **Race Night** to raise funds towards Cowbit Village Hall and Cowbit St Mary's Church will be held on **Saturday 8th June at 7:00 pm**. Hi everyone,

A number of announcements first, the Council are now back up to strength with the co-option of Ben Halgarth & Patrick Mews and we welcome them both.

The Annual Open Meeting was held at Weston Hills Village Hall on the 22nd April and although no representative from the National Grid was present, our local MP Sir John Hayes sent a report that was read out supporting the objection to the proposals which would effect large areas of Weston especially the Marsh area.

On the 13th May we held our AGM and both myself and Cllr Janet Bellamy were re-elected as Chair and Vice Chair respectively. From a personal perspective myself and all the Councillor's will endeavour to continue our commitment to the Parish and look forward to the upgrades to both the Weston Park & Weston Hills Park, for which we owe an enormous thank you to Cllr's Bellamy, Brotherton & Ellis for their tireless work to make these upgrades possible. There is to be a D Day celebration at Weston Park on the 6th June with the lighting of our beacon, so look out for the widespread advertising of this Parish event and we hope to see as many of you there on the night.

I have been asked by several residents in Weston to request that all villagers to take a pride in the village, as many of you do already, however there has been a noticeable increase of litter being thrown into some of the ditches & dykes, plus graffiti down the Small Drove area close to Delgate Avenue, which is not what the majority of villagers want or expect. So could I ask everyone if you see some litter please place it in a bin and if you see graffiti please report it to the Parish Council so we can take some action.

With this in mind the CCTV system which will be installed in Weston Park will be of a quality that will be able to identify those responsible for causing anti social behaviour/criminal damage and will be used by the Council to consider prosecutions via Lincolnshire Police. Both Parks are for the enjoyment of all residents and hopefully we can force the minority to stop their illegal activities.

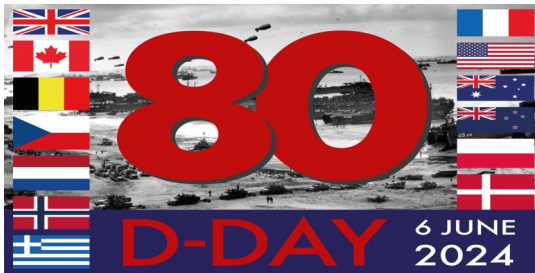

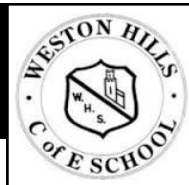

We began the summer term with a welcome invitation to join in with the decoration of our local village church, St John's, for their flower festival. In keeping with the theme of the festival, our school display challenged visitors to identify the nursery rhymes on our flower inspired musical staves (glockenspiels provided!).

Continuing the theme of being part of our local community, in May, the School Council joined the community coffee mornings at the village hall. The children shared some books, cake and stories with other visitors and the events were enjoyed by all.

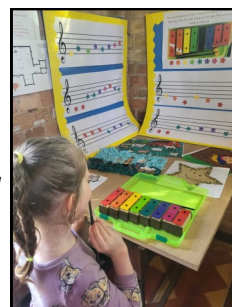
This term, as always, there has been a lot of interactive learning. Holly Class have been studying plants, investigating how they grow best. They have been trying to find out if plants can have too much heat by placing them near a radiator, on top of a water bottle, wrapping them in towels and blasting them with a hairdryer twice a day. They have also dissected flowers to find all the parts: stigma, style, ovary, ovules, filament, anther, pollen and understand how they are necessary for pollination then fertilisation. As part of their 'Down Under' topic work, Holly Class have been creating beautiful Aboriginal inspired dot paintings.



As part of Key Stage 1 'Wriggle and Crawl' topic this term, Cherry and Oak Classes had the privilege of welcoming Captivating Creatures, who brought some amazing visitors to show to the children including a bearded dragon, a giant African Train Millipede and an Asian Forest Scorpion. The children were especially pleased to meet Boris, the 23-year-old tarantula.



We are now at the time of year when children throughout the school are formally assessed nationwide. We are extremely proud of the way our Year 6 children have approached their SATs recently. They were incredibly confident and focussed, remained calm throughout and did their very best (which is all anyone can ask of them). The Year 2 children will soon begin to complete their tests, along with the Year 4 multiplication checks and the EYFS reception assessments. We are immensely proud of all of our children, they take everything in their stride, try so very hard and are a credit to our school and their families. We will continue to celebrate all their achievements throughout the year. This term we have a wider range of extra-curricular school activities than ever! These include Sports Club, Tennis, Netball, Homework, Just Dance, Drama, Young Carers, Marathon Kids and Dodgeball. In our Boomwhackers club, parents are invited to join their children and take part in the activity too. We also have Gardening Club, supported by our PTA, The Friends of Weston Hills, to whom we are extremely grateful. We are delighted to offer so many enrichment experiences at our school, with something for children of all ages and interests to enjoy and new things to try.

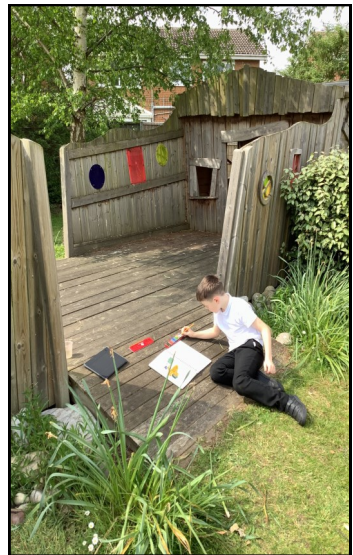

It's been a hive of activity here at Weston St Mary C of E Primary School lately! Our pupils have been busy bees, enjoying exciting educational experiences both near and far. To support their learning in History, our Year 3 and 4 pupils went for a trip at Peterborough Museum. Meanwhile, Year 1 and 2 embarked on their own expedition to Lincoln Museum. Both trips were a huge success, and the children returned full of enthusiasm and stories about their days out.

Since returning from the Easter break, pupils in Reception and Years 1 and 2 have been making quite the splash with their weekly swimming sessions at Whaplode C of E Primary School. Beyond just having fun in the pool, these sessions are essential for imparting crucial water safety skills which is why children from all year groups will be swimming weekly from June onwards.

As well as getting out of school, children have been enjoying spending more time outside on the school grounds now that the weather has improved. Year 5 and 6 have completed some beautiful artwork outside, including water colour paintings which they completed out on the school field. At the other end of school, our Reception pupils have been printing patterns using fruit and vegetables.

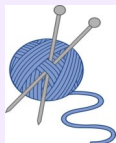

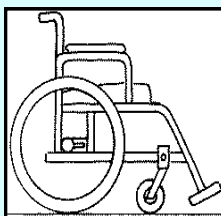

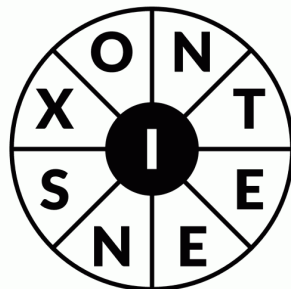
