Andrew, Anthony and Thomas start the new year with mixed views regarding the future of our area. We begin with a positive by sharing news that at the February meeting of the Planning Committee, plans were passed for a new Leisure Centre at The Castle Sports Complex in Spalding. Of the £26m project, £20m is being provided by Central Government, where the new Government honoured the agreement made by the previous Government to give the £20m as part of it's levelling-up fund. A lot of work has happened behind the scenes and Andrew, Anthony and Thomas were all in attendance and voted for the approval of the plans, which will see demolition of the existing swimming pool building, following construction of a two storey extension on the Albion Street site entrance. Included in the new development will be 2 swimming pools, upgraded sports facilities, along with a 3G pitch, running track and other outdoor play areas. In addition a second application for a 70 unit extra care housing facility, which will be sited in the area of the current swimming pool were also approved.

Something of more concern is the announcement by the Government, who outlined plans to introduce a directly elected mayor for every region and incorporate district councils into wider authorities in a devolution white paper - a move that could be the biggest shake-up in more than 50 years. Although this is very early days, it could be the end of District Councils as we know it, and see local representation extremely diluted with the Government's initial minimum target of population being 500,000. Currently, as South Holland District Council, the population is just over 90,000. However, as SHDC is in shared partnership agreement with Boston Borough and East Lindsey Council, together this increases to around 350,000. The government appear keen to move at pace, so a lot of work will be going on, but with your 3 Ward members all living in the Ward and having in-depth knowledge of the area, the potential of loosing this, and decisions being made much further away are of concern. Watch this space.

In a new way to communicate with residents, SHDC is pleased to announce the launch of its first WhatsApp Channel, providing residents and visitors with another convenient way to stay informed about local happenings. Residents can now sign up to receive updates about the latest news, exciting events, activities, and services in their communities directly on their smartphones. Follow South Holland District Council on WhatsApp today!

Finally, Andrew's going Charity running again, by participating in the London Landmarks Half Marathon on Sunday 6th April. Andrew will be joined by his good friend Mark Schmidt and Councillor Ingrid Sheard, collectively raising money for one of Andrew's Chairman's Charities - Blood Cancer UK. Guinness Cake

Method

- 1. Preheat the oven to 160°c/140°fan. Grease and line two 20cm/8" round tins.
- 2. In a pan, add the butter, and heat until melted.
- 3. Take the pan off the heat, and pour in the Guinness, cocoa powder, sugar, milk and eggs.
- 4. Whisk the mixture together until smooth.5. Add the plain flour, and bicarbonate of soda.
- then mix briefly until fully combined.
 6. Divide the mixture evenly between the two
- tins, and bake in the oven for 40-45 minutes, or until baked through.
- 7. Once baked, leave to cool fully in the tins whilst you prepare the icing
- 8. Beat the room temp unsalted butter on it's own in a bowl for a few minutes to loosen it.
- 9. Add in the icing sugar, and beat again I beat this for about 5 minutes, to make it really smooth.
- 10. Make sure the cream cheese doesn't have any excess water I find it best to add it to a bowl first just to make sure.
- 11. Add in the cream cheese, and vanilla and beat. At first, it may look a little weird, but just keep on beating until it is smooth, and creamy.
- 12. Spread half of the frosting onto the first layer of the cake, then add the second layer of cake.
- 13. Add on the rest of the frosting, and decorate with grated chocolate. Enjoy!

For the cake:

- 175 g unsalted butter
- 150 ml Guinness
- 50 g cocoa powder
- 250 g light brown soft sugar
- 125 ml whole milk
- 3 medium eggs
- 250 g plain flour
- 1 tsp bicarbonate of soda

For the icing:

- 150 g unsalted butter (room temp)
- 150 g icing sugar
- 300 g full-fat soft cream cheese
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- Dark chocolate grated (optional)

The last few weeks have been fairly busy for the Village Hall Committee, who have made some improvements to the hall that we hope will make using it easier and more enjoyable.

Eighteen tonnes of gravel were received in the first week of January to improve the car park surface, which now looks far better than it did. Huge thanks to Committee members Chris Aldridge, Marcus Pell and Darren Harper as well as Danny from Broad Build and Mark from Livewire Electrical to help spread it evenly around the car park.... certainly a great way of warming up on a cold, frosty morning! Inside, Claire and Marcus Pell have arranged the display of some village photos that help to capture what Cowbit is all about.... if anyone happens to have any photos that they feel would look good in this display and that they would be happy to share, we'd love to hear from you (bookings@cowbitvillage.co.uk). We have also been fortunate enough to have been awarded £250 from the SHDC Warm Spaces Project, which seeks to support community projects during the winter months, especially for those that may otherwise be isolated or may need to restrict their heating. Some of this funding will go towards keeping the hall warm with the remainder spilt equally between Tea@2, Cowbit Seniors Club and Cowbit Crafters to support provision of food and activities.

In terms of bookings, we have recently needed to amend our booking terms and conditions following some damage that was incurred following hire for a private party. The Hall Committee work incredibly hard to maintain the hall as a pleasant facility for the village and we were – naturally – upset and disappointed that a group had not treated our lovely hall with the care we feel it deserves. We hope that these amendments will ensure such damage does not happen again in the future. And finally, last year's SHDC Chairman's Charity Quiz Night was so successful, that we have been asked to host one again. We hope that everybody had a lovely Christmas and wonderful New Year. It has been a very cold and crisp start to the New Year here at Cowbit St Mary's C of E Primary School. Autumn Term was certainly a busy one with lots of

In November, we were very lucky to have Christina join us from Lives to teach First Aid across the school. Our youngest children learnt what to do in an emergency with the help of Christina's friend Teddy. They learnt the importance of knowing their home address and shouting for help just in case they ever needed to ring 999 for an ambulance. Our oldest children learnt what to do in an emergency and how to call 999. Christina advised them to download 'what three words,' to help share their location and learn their home address. The children practised the recovery position and CPR on a dummy. They had a great day and were keen to share their new skills!



Year 6 took travelled to London for a jam-packed residential! We had a great time at the Imperial War Museum in preparation for our History learning this term and loved seeing the Crown Jewels at the Tower of London. We went to see Wicked the Musical and had a sightseeing tour of London. We made fantastic memories and had a great time meeting some new friends from other local schools.



Maple Class went to Flag Fen as part of their history learning. They had a great day learning about the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age by making clay pots the same way the children did in the Neolithic period. They got a chance to be historians and explore artefacts to determine which period they came from. In the afternoon, the children learnt how Bronze Age boats were preserved and got to sit in a replica, before finishing their day off with a fire in the Iron Age roundhouse. The children had a wonderful day!



Oak Class had Magistrates in the Community visit us in January. Mr Daniel Sheard, our presenter, is a magistrate in both Boston and Lincoln Court. We learnt that most magistrates are volunteers. We participated in a mock court based on a real-life case. We were

Engagement with parents and carers is a priority for us at Weston Hills Church of England Primary School and this term we are

continuing with our 'Parent Pathway' to provide opportunities for parents and carers to be more informed about what their children are learning and the progress they are making throughout the year. In September, we started with our Meet the **Teacher** sessions, with parents and carers joining us to learn about class routines, expectations and learning for the year ahead. Through our Parents in Class sessions, our teachers work with parents and carers in the classrooms on a weekly basis. The focus in term 1 was reading and this term we have moved on to Maths. On our Open Book Tuesday, parents are invited to come and look through their child's books, with our class teachers available throughout. Parent Information Events (PIE) take place throughout the year, including curriculum evenings which provide greater information about specific subject areas. This year we have already held a Maths PIE, with a phonics one planned for this term. The Parent Pathway also includes Open Mornings with children having their lessons as normal, and parents invited to come into school and walk around 'freely' to see children engaged in them. The Parent Pathway sits alongside our usual methods of sharing information about teaching, learning and children's progress and attainment with parents and carers, including through assessment report cards, end of year reports and our communication direct with parents and through the school website.


