South Holland District Council



At the February meeting of Full Council, the 2025/26 budget was set in what was one of the most challenging budgets ever known. This was due to unprecedented changes in funding levels from Central Government, the impact of the special levy to support the vital work of Internal Drainage Boards and continued changes in resident, customer, and business needs. Councillors approved a Council Tax rise of £7.11 for a Band D property which equates to £208.53 per year. This represents an increase of 14p per week or 2p per day to deliver district council services such as refuse collection, planning, housing, environmental health and much more. The vast majority of properties in South Holland are band A, B and C so will see increases lower than this. Lincolnshire County Council, the Police and Crime Commissioner for Lincolnshire and parish councils also set their own council tax rates which form part of the annual bill.

In nearby Moulton Chapel, the SHDC Housing Delivery Team recently completed the purchase of 2 properties on Primus Close. The properties are both HRA-rented and will be let to applicants on the housing register. The delivery of these 2 properties concludes the wider project which saw the delivery of rented and shared ownership homes for the HRA and market rent homes delivered by SHDC owned Welland Homes, and offers new residents newly built properties at affordable cost. Further positive news came from announcing a significant 13% decrease in fly-tipping incidents over the past 12 months, demonstrating the impact of increased enforcement and public awareness, in keeping our District clean. The latest figures reveal that fly-tipping incidents fell from 2,732 cases in 2023 to 2,402 in 2024. Several areas have seen substantial reductions, with the largest being Crowland and Deeping St Nicholas (down by 51%) This success is a result of collaborative efforts between enforcement teams, volunteers and resi-dents who actively report incidents. Despite this progress, the Andrew, Anthony and Thomas urge residents to remain vigilant and continue reporting any fly-tipping incidents through the official website at **www.sholland.gov.uk/reportit.**





Crème Egg Cheesecake

Method

1. Crush the digestive biscuits and mix with the melted butter before pressing into a 7 inch tin to form the cheesecake base.

2. Unwrap the mini Crème Eggs and chop into quarters.

3. Fold together the whipped cream, icing sugar, cream cheese, lemon juice and chopped up Crème Eggs until fully combined. Pour onto the biscuit base and smooth with the back of a spoon or knife.

4. Pop the cheesecake into the fridge to chill for at least 6 hours

5. Once well chilled, remove the cheesecake from the fridge and take it out of the tin.

6. If using the optional decoration, melt the milk chocolate and allow to cool very slightly before drizzling over the cake. Then melt the white chocolate in the same way and drizzle half of it over the cheesecake before colouring the remaining chocolate with the yellow food colouring and drizzling this over also

7. Cut the large Crème Eggs in half and use to decorate the top of the cheesecake

Who doesn't love a Crème Egg or two at Easter?!! If you are looking for an easy cheesecake to wow family or friends (or just to treat yourself) this delicious dessert looks far more impressive than it should given how quick and easy it is to pull together. A great tip is to use a non-stick, loose bottomed cake tin to make removing the cheesecake super-simple.



Ingredients For the cake:

- 280gms Chocolate digestive chocolate biscuits
- 140qms Butter, melted
- 560mls Double cream, whipped • to form soft peaks
- 140ams Icina sugar
- 560 g Philadelphia cream cheese, ideally full fat
- Juice of half a lemon
- 275gms Cadbury's mini Crème Eqq
- 4 standard size Crème Eggs

Optional decoration

- 60qms milk chocolate
- 120qms white chocolate
- Yellow food colouring

WESTON PARISH COUNCIL



Firstly a big welcome to our two new councillors Helen Redman and Tony Mather who returns after a 2 year break, there is however a vacancy due to the resignation of Louise Ellis and therefore we are looking to encourage another local resident to join the Council. Next, onto planning matters, as some of you might be aware that the planning application to change the use of the Bell PH on Austendyke Rd to a Spar Convenience store has been withdrawn and although the reasons are unknown I'm sure that most residents who would have been effected by this application are hoping it stays withdrawn. The Council received a planning application for 24 affordable homes on

farm land on Broadgate in Weston Hills and although in the pass Weston Hills has been described as "Unsustainable" and is not in the S.E.L.L.P area for large developments. The application is using a a clause in building regulations known as RES, (Rural Exception Sites.) The Parish Council debated this application at their March meeting, having listened firstly to residents of Weston Hills who turned up in their numbers to make their objections known. The Council have sent their views/objections to the Planning Officers at SHDC and we now wait to see what the Planning Committee decide. The Council felt that besides the usual objections is eswage, flooding, privacy evasion, they would also query the legality of this application as it appears that certain procedural matters have been ignored ie consultation of the Parish Council and more importantly the residents who would be effected by this development.

Lastly the CCTV in Weston Park is up and running and can be monitored remotely by certain Councillors. The Weston Park gates opening times changed on the 1st April to between 0700-1900 until BST ends.
