May is the month where the annual reset button is pressed as SHDC. At the time of writing this article, it is not known what, if any changes have been made, and an update will follow in the next edition. However, one thing confirmed is that Andrew will step down as Chairman, as his 2 year period ends. Andrew would like to thank everyone who has supported him and is honoured to have held the position. As well as representing the District at many events, Andrew also hosted his own events within the circulation area of this magazine, and is extremely grateful for all the kind help given. In addition, Andrew raised over £20,000 for his Chairman's Charities Blood Cancer UK and Spalding Mencap. Andrew, Anthony and Thomas were delighted to hear that Welland Homes, a housing company wholly owned by South Holland District Council, made a £100,373 donation to three local charities, after a successful year, helping to support in-need residents and good causes across the district. Citizens Advice South Lincolnshire will receive £91,173, which will be used in their continued work to provide free, independent, confidential and impartial advice on rights and responsibilities, giving support on a range of matters including consumer matters, money advice, welfare support, employment, housing and family and personal matters. Active Lincolnshire will benefit from £6,000 of support, for their work to provide opportunities for everyone in Lincolnshire to be active every day. This includes working with partners to address inequalities and inactivity and responding to the specific needs of people and places, and South Holland in Bloom will receive £3,200 to aid them to provide assistance and support in connection with the Britain in Bloom competition to various village across the district.

Speaking of donations, Andrew, Anthony and Thomas still have funds available from their Designated Ward Budgets (DCB). DCB's are monies made available for local organisations to apply for funding, and can be spent on events or item's which benefit the community – for example, the last donations were given to All Saints Church, Moulton for flowers which were used for the Flower Festival held at the beginning of May. 



Strawberry Meringue Roulade

Ingredients

- 5 egg whites
- 275g/10oz caster sugar
- 20g/2oz flaked almonds

For the filling

- 150ml/5fl oz double cream
- 200ml/7fl oz Greekstyle yoghurt
- 225g/8oz strawberries, hulled
- icing sugar, for dusting

Method

- 1. Preheat the oven to 200C/180C Fan/Gas 6.
- 2. Grease a 33cm x 23cm/13in x 10in Swiss roll tin and line with baking paper.
- 3. Whisk the egg whites in a clean, large bowl with an electric mixer on high-speed until very stiff.
- Gradually add the sugar, 1 teaspoon at a time and, keeping the mixer on a high-speed, whisk well between each addition. Whisk until very, very stiff and glossy and all the sugar has been added.
- 5. Spread the meringue mixture into the lined tin and sprinkle with the almonds. Put the tin in the oven and bake for about 8 minutes until golden.
- 6. Lower the temperature to 160C/140C Fan/Gas 3 and bake for a further 15 minutes, until crisp and firm to the touch.
- Remove the meringue from the oven and turn almond-side down onto a sheet of baking paper.
- 8. Remove the paper from the base of the cooked meringue and allow to cool for 10 minutes.
- Lightly whip the cream and mix with the yoghurt. Spread evenly over the meringue.
- 10. Cut the strawberries into quarters and sprinkle over the cream mixture.
- 11. Roll up the meringue firmly, using the paper to help you, from the long end of the roulade. It is essential you keep the roll very tight.
- 12. When you are ready to serve, dust with icing sugar and cut into slices.





This is **NEEDLESS DESTRUCTION** and **LINCOLNSHIRE** is fighting back!



As I write this, the sun is shining at Weston Marsh, water is glistening on the River Welland, the birds are singing and the acres and acres of crops in the fields are looking well. But this is to change and residents of the area are facing drastic changes. Life here for us changed in July 2022 with news of an Outer Dowsing Wind Farm proposed converter station. It soon became apparent to us that we were faced with the construction of a National Grid 35acre substation with many extra pylons. After nearly 3 years, we are also faced with underground cabling from the Outer Dowsing Wind Farm and the EGL 3 and 4 projects, more with Ossian Wind Farm plus 2 new converter stations totalling 37.5acres in the Weston/Weston Marsh area, more massive pylons totalling over 7 miles connecting from Meridian Solar Farm into us and also an unknown connection from Spalding Battery Energy Storage System. And this is what we know about already with more projects expected!

We are not alone! All over the country this is happening. Here in South Lincolnshire on some of the best land in the country – where is our food going to coming from when the worst happens?? Food security is vital to the country! Massive disruption for several years to the local area with construction traffic, could be in the region of up to 500 lorries and vehicles per day driving through our major roads and country lanes.

If you think I am exaggerating go over the border to Norfolk, to Walpole and West Walton, where over the last few years their area has become an industrial site, substations, battery storage, masses of pylons and solar panels with more planned before 2030. And this is what will happen to Weston Marsh and the Weston area! What can we do? - Go along to any meetings, consultation meetings and comment on any proposals.

<u>Residents are being urged to have their say</u> on plans for a 900-hectare (2,223 acres) solar development on farmland between Crowland and Gedney Hill.

Meridian Solar has not yet given a precise date for the next round of public consultation, indicating some time this Spring, but Meridian Action Group (MAG) is keen that no one misses their opportunity to make their views known about what could become one of the biggest developments of its type in Europe

One good way to keep up to date with developments, and be forewarned of the public consultation, is to join Meridian Action Group on Facebook.

The solar development is planned for five sites and, together with pylons, will impact Gedney Hill, Sutton St James, Holbeach Drove, Whaplode Drove, Shepeau Stow, Crowland, **Cowbit**, Holbeach St Johns, Whaplode St Catherine, Moulton Chapel, Moulton, Moulton Seas End, **Weston Hills and Weston.**

It will consist of hundreds of thousands of ground-mounted solar panels, inverters, transformers, switchgear, substation and control buildings, battery storage, fencing and security measures and pylons connecting over 12 kilometres (seven miles) to a new National Grid substation at Weston Marsh.

The Stage 2 statutory consultation, planned for this year, will provide greater detail and it will be at this time that residents will be able to register any comments.


MAG is registered on Meridian's consultation list and will receive notification of documents as they are published and will then make people aware of their availability.

I would like to think we have delivered on our mandate to improve the Council's facilities with the monies from the S106 funding from the two housing estates in Weston.


