As we start to settle into 2026, there will be challenges for SHDC, with the highest being the changes to waste collections. Whether we like it or not, due to Government ruling, South Holland will be moving from weekly refuse and recycling bag collections, to wheelie bins. With potential start date around August, SHDC now need to work on policies to ensure, once commencement has taken place, it is done with a minimal change as possible to residents. The first meeting to work through these policies took place just before Christmas at a special meeting of the Policy Development Panel. Normal process would be for comments from the Panel to be noted and passed onto Cabinet who ultimately make the final decision. However, after the meeting, which lasted almost four hours and Councillors scrutinising every piece of the proposed policy, rather than passing onto Cabinet, it was rejected and sent back to officers to work on, and find solutions to many areas of concern raised. The next meeting will take place early February.

Another challenge will be setting the budget for 2025/26. Otherwise known as Council Tax setting, the setting of the budget forms SHDC part of the Council Tax we pay, and is further made up from Lincolnshire County Council, Police Crime Commissioner, Parish Council and Drainage Boards. Meetings to scrutinise the budget will be taking place in January, with the final meeting taking place at Full Council at the end of February. Local Authorities face financial pressures, whilst continuing to deliver key services. Through careful management, SHDC has weathered the pressures of previous years, and hope to do the same this time as much as possible.

Thank you to everyone who supported Andrew's Charity Coffee Morning, which was held in All Saint's Church Moulton at the beginning of January. Whether it be helping on the day, baking a cake, donating a raffle prize, or just turning up to support, it is all very much appreciated. £452 was made on the day, which was split equally between Moulton Community Association and Moulton Park.

Fidget Pie

*Did you know that Mon 2nd to Sun 8th March 2026 is **British Pie Week**? In celebration of this beloved British dish – and because as a Nation we are pretty good at making and eating a darned good pie – we bring you a really easy pie recipe that can be rustled up in a jiffy.*

Fidget pie originated in Shropshire and initially resembled something similar to a Cornish pasty – there are several theories on its strange name but the most likely explanation is that it is named because of its ingredients' tendency to shuffle around in their pastry case when baked. It is amazing when served with a couple of dollops of creamy mash and a large spoonful of buttery peas!

Ingredients

- 500g shortcrust pastry, home made or shop bought .
- 450g bacon
- 300g onions, chopped
- 450g cooking apples, peeled, cored and sliced
- 1 tbsp dried sage
- 150ml Cider
- Seasoning
- Beaten egg to glaze



Method

1. Preheat the oven to 200°C or Gas Mark 6 and find a large dish that measures about 30cms x 20cms
2. De-rind and chop the bacon then mix with the onions and apple. Season with salt, pepper and sage.
3. Place the filling into a large dish and pour in the cider.
4. Roll out the pastry so that it is large enough to cover the pie dish – press the edges down well to seal.
5. Cut a cross in the centre of the pie and fold back the triangles to expose the filling. Brush tops with beaten egg and bake for 25 – 30 minutes until pastry is golden brown and the filling bubbling.

Hi Everyone

Albeit slightly late but may I wish all residents a peaceful and healthy New Year. Reflecting on 2025 your Council managed to furnish Weston Park with some its new play equipment including the Zip Wire which I hope as the weather improves will get used a lot. There are other items which will be installed in the Spring time to finish the hard work carried out by several councillors to improve the facilities of both Weston & Weston Hills parks. To that end my sincere thanks goes to

Cllrs Janet Bellamy & Annabel Brotherton .

There is of course the ongoing matter of the Energy Projects which could effect both Weston & Weston Hills if they go ahead and especially those residents living in the idyllic area of the Marsh which could have two large sub stations and it needs all residents to make your feelings known to the authorities if we are to stop these projects, which I understand will bring no benefit to this area, just years of chaos. Residents need to see and know what could happen to the road network around Weston.

A meeting was arranged with the Head of Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership (LRSP) on the 12 January to discuss what measures could be taken to reduce the speeding vehicles along both Austendyke Rd and the High Rd in Weston, this after a number of surveys were carried out on the High Rd, but not Austendyke Rd, which as a council we found unbelievable.

It has been agreed with LRSP for them to carry out traffic surveys at 3 points along the 40mph stretch of Austendyke Rd which hopefully lead to road side speeding checks by LRSP personnel who will be in possession of hand held devices with cameras. We have also asked them to check the east of the junction of Broadgate and Austendyke Rd as drivers views to the right for traffic coming from Spalding is still impaired and we hope they can come up with some suggestions for drivers approaching this junction on Austendyke Rd. We will of course update residents of any developments.






