This month's edition, largely focuses on 2 key point from the last edition. The first point gives an update on the significant changes to refuse and recycling happening later this year by moving from weekly refuse and recycling bag collections; to wheelee bins being collected at separate times over the course of a month. Following initial rejection of proposed policies by the Policy Development Panel, officers came back with revised policies, which although not perfect, as written are in the best possible way of being fit for purpose. These changes were then approved by Cabinet at a meeting in February. Further details of the rollout/collection dates etc with follow in due course.

The second point relates to Council Tax setting for 2026/27. At Full Council on Thursday 26th February, councillors approved a Council Tax increase of £6.39 for a Band D property (most properties in South Holland fall into Bands A–C and will see a smaller rise), equivalent to just 12.3p per week for district council services including waste collection, planning, housing, environmental health and more. Whilst nobody likes increases, and recognising the cost of living pressures for people, SHDC faced another year of significant financial challenges, including national economic uncertainty, inflationary pressures and increasing demand for council services.

A significant and ongoing pressure on the Council's finances remains the Internal Drainage Board (IDB) Special Levy, with 55% of the Council's Council Tax now going to IDBs. The Council must fund this levy from Council Tax income, reducing the amount for local services. IDB's aside, the approved budget provides a sustainable financial position for the year ahead, delivering further efficiencies while investing in key priorities, which include investment in leisure facilities with the South Holland Wellbeing Hub, supporting vulnerable residents with Disabled Facilities Grants, and delivering the district-wide waste service review.

Should Spalding have a Town Council? The Government is proposing to reduce the number of Councils in England by 2028 through Local Government Reorganisation, meaning it is likely South Holland District Council will no longer exist in its current form. However, town and parish councils will remain. Unlike many other towns in Lincolnshire, Spalding currently does not have a parish/town council. The Council is now consulting on whether you think Spalding should have its own parish/town council through a Community Governance Review (CGR). The area under review focusses on the unparished area of Spalding and its boundaries with surrounding parishes in Cowbit, Deeping St Nicholas, Pinchbeck and Weston. Residents who live in the unparished area of Spalding currently pay a Special Expense. Should a Parish/Town Council be formed those residents would pay a precept to the newly formed Parish/Town Council. The consultation closes on Monday 30th March 2026, so be quick and go to Sholland.gov.uk.

Rhubarb and Custard Biscuits

What better way to take advantage of the first crops of rhubarb than to rustle up these moreish little biscuits that are fabulous with a mug of tea



Method

1. Preheat the oven to 180°C/160°C fan/gas 4 and line a small baking tray with baking paper.
 2. Firstly, make the filling by spreading the rhubarb out on the lined baking tray and roasting it for 30 minutes or until its softened. Remove from the oven and allow to cool before transferring to the small bowl of a food processor. Whizz to a purée, then add the butter, icing sugar and lemon juice before whizzing for a couple more minutes: it seems like a long time, but you want it to thicken.
 3. Transfer the filling to a small bowl and chill in the fridge for 2 hours to firm up. You don't want the icing to be at all runny, so add a little more icing sugar if necessary; it needs to hold when sandwiched between the biscuits.
 4. To make the biscuit dough, sift the flour, custard powder, icing sugar and salt into a bowl and then either mix by hand or use electric mixer on a low speed to combine. Add the butter and mix on a low speed until the mixture resembles breadcrumbs then add the vanilla extract. Beat vigorously until the dough comes together.
 5. Reduce the oven temperature to 170°C/150°C fan/gas 3. Line 2 baking trays with baking paper. Pinch off small bits of dough and use your hands to roll them into 3cm balls: you should have enough for 30, weighing about 15g each. Put them on the lined baking trays, spaced about 4cm apart. Dip the back of the prongs of a small fork in flour before gently but firmly pressing down onto each ball: they will expand to about 3.5cm wide, but don't press all the way to the bottom; you just want to create firm lines in the dough rather than force them to spread out.
 6. Bake for 25 minutes, rotating the trays halfway through, until the biscuits are dry on the bottom but haven't taken on too much colour. They'll be relatively fragile when warm but still firm to the touch. Set aside on the trays to cool for 5 minutes before cooling completely on a wire rack.
 7. To assemble, sandwich pairs of biscuits together with the icing, with the forked sides facing outwards. You should use about 15g icing in each biscuit. It will seem like a lot, but trust us – the biscuits can take it!
- Enjoy!

Ingredients

For the biscuits:

- 175g plain flour, plus 1 tbs extra to dust
- 65g custard powder
- 65g icing sugar
- 1/8 tsp fine salt
- 170g unsalted butter, at room temperature, cubed
- ¼ tsp vanilla extract

For the filling:

- 70g (about 1 small stick) rhubarb, trimmed, washed and cut into 3cm lengths
- 65g unsalted butter, at room temperature, cubed
- 130g icing sugar
- ½ tsp lemon juice

Cowbit Church Update....

As we mentioned in the last edition of the Elloe Oracle, our forthcoming fundraising will focus on raising money to repair our church clock, which the eagle eyed will not be current reading about 2 mins to twelve. As we don't have much else to report this time, we thought it might be interesting to share a little history about the clock (with huge thanks to Shirley Pugh for her research, which has proved invaluable).

Although we have records to suggest a church clock has existed on the St Mary's Church tower since at least the 1700's, not too much is known about any clock before 1907. In March 1907, according to the Rural Ministry Log, the old clock was inspected for possible replacement by Joyce and Company of Whitchurch because the clock had become stuck with the hands pointing to tea time – as this was many years before anyone had reliable access to a watch, the lack of a clock within the village was a real problem. A meeting of the parish committee that was held on 16th April 1907, agreed to the purchase of a new clock and set about raising funds to purchase it – this included a concert and May Day dance that was held on 16th May 1907 and raised the princely sum of four pounds, five shillings and eight pence.

The current clock arrived at Cowbit Station on 12th July 1907 and work commenced to install it on 18th July 1907. By 19th July 1907, the dial of the new clock was in place on the tower and the hands were fixed in place meaning that the inauguration of the new clock could go ahead on the public celebration event that had been arranged for 25th July 1907. The current dial is smaller than previous dials and – if you look really closely, you can see where space that was used by the previous clock was cemented up to make the new clock look better.

For many years, the clock was kept in good working order by a small team of volunteers who would climb the tower steps once per week to manually wind the clock (as a child, I can remember following my Auntie Vida up the tower, whilst she brandished a huge winding key.... she was in her eighties at the time but continued to take her clock winding responsibilities very seriously!). In March 2014, the clock developed an irreparable fault and hence an appeal was launched to raise sufficient funds to have it mended. In addition to villagers donating generously, grants were received which included a large sum from the Heritage Lottery Fund. The appeal raised enough money to repair the clock install a new floor in the belfry and add electrics to the clock in order to give it an automatic windings system.

Please do keep an eye out for details of our current appeal and the fundraising events that we will be holding to support it.

Spring is in the air!

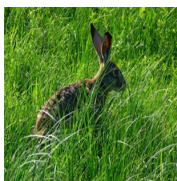
News from Cowbit Parish Council

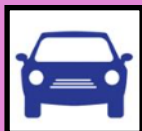

During the half term break, we invited the children to take part in an extended Home Study Project.

They were invited to make a model from whatever they wished linked to the current learning topic for their class. The children returned to school with some incredible models and sculptures. The amazing results were displayed in a 'Grand Exhibition' in our school hall, with parents and carers invited. The models were made using a variety of materials including Lego, papier-mache and even cake, demonstrating the wonderful imaginations and creative talents of our children.



We are always excited to celebrate World Book Day in March, and this year we had a range of activities to encourage a love of books and reading for pleasure. To help every single child in our school to start or continue to build their own personal library of books, we held a book swap, where children could exchange their pre-loved books. The children and staff were invited to come to school dressed as a book character or wearing something connected to their interest or passion. There were some amazing and imaginative costumes! The children were really excited about the arrival of a vending machine at our school – which contains books. Tokens for the vending machine were awarded for the most creative costumes, enabling a book of choice to be selected and dispensed.



Holly Class have had an exciting term, with the topic of Dinosaurs which is always one of the children's favourites. They looked fossils, investigated how they were created and when before making their own trace fossils from Plaster of Paris.

They also recorded video presentations in groups explaining the process of fossilisation. In Cherry Class, the children have been investigating 'the science behind the fairy tale'. They looked at which biscuit would be the best for building a house. Shortbread was the clear winner!

Since September we have been hosting parent / carer coffee mornings once every half term. Parents and carers are invited to join us for coffee (with biscuits!) and get information on our topic for that session, including from some of the external partner agencies we work with in school. The sessions offer information and the opportunity to ask questions and meet our school staff. Previous coffee mornings have been with the Working Together Team and the Mental Health Support Team, and we have the Behavioural Outreach Support Service joining us for the next one. Parents and carers are finding the sessions valuable and welcome that we can tailor the sessions to their interests and information needs.

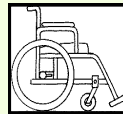

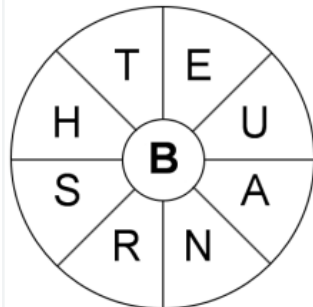
